1. Introduction

(Times New Roman, 12 pt, bold; text justified, single line spacing)

The introduction should clearly define the research problem, objectives and relevance of the study. It should outline the structure of the paper and position the research within the existing literature.

2. Theoretical Background / Literature Review

This section should present the relevant theoretical and conceptual framework and review key literature related to the research topic. Concepts should be clearly defined and properly referenced using APA style.

3. Methodology

This section should describe the research design, data sources, sample, methods of data collection and analysis. Ethical considerations should be addressed where applicable.

4. Results

The results section should present the findings of the study in a clear and logical manner. Tables and figures should be used where appropriate and referenced in the text.

5. Discussion

This section should interpret the results in relation to the research objectives and existing literature. The implications of the findings should be clearly discussed.

6. Conclusion

The conclusion should summarize the main findings of the research, highlight its contribution and outline limitations and directions for future research.
